Ceanothus americanus

- ❁ Glossy leaves, numerous bright white flowers in summer & a mounding habit make this compact shrub a popular garden member.
- ❁ Attractive to hummingbirds, which eat the tiny insects that pollinate the flowers.
- ❁ The name New Jersey Tea was coined during the American Revolution because its leaves were used as a substitute for imported tea.
- ❁ Also known as Redroot
- ❁ Native to all of Ontario & Quebec
