Valentine Bleeding Heart

Dicentra Spectabilis 'Valentine'

- Valentine features graceful grey green foliage with a somewhat ferny appearance. Striking cherry-red, heart-shaped flowers with protruding white inner petals hang in a row from long, arching, burgundy stems above the foliage in mid to late spring.
- Best in partial shade, or at least protection from hot afternoon sun. After flowering, Bleeding Heart should be cut back to rejuvenate the foliage. Even still, these often go completely dormant by midsummer, to return again the following spring
