Sharp-Lobed Hepatica

Hepatica acutiloba

- One of the earliest woodland wildflowers. Forms semi-evergreen clumps that are adorned with adorable bowl shaped flowers, that while usually white may also be pale pink or lavender. Rich in nectar, an important early source for many pollinators. The blooms close at night and on cloudy days when pollinators are unlikely to be flying.
- Handsome foliage is divided into three lobes and turn shades of russet red and deep purple in fall.
- Also known as Sharp-lobed Liverleaf
- Native to Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, & Nova Scotia
